On-site medical coverage is provided 16 hours per day (five days a week) and 12 hours per day on weekends. The RN is on call when not on-site. A physician or other advanced level provider is on-site one day per week and on-call for consultation as needed.
The facility has sufficient space and equipment to afford detainee privacy when receiving health care.	×			
The medical facility has its own restricted-access area. The restricted access area is located within the confines of the secure perimeter.	×

<ul> <li>Medical screening includes a Tuberculosis (TB) test.</li> <li>Every arriving detainee receives a TB test during the admission process;</li> <li>Detainee's TB-screening does not occur more than one business day after his/her arrival at the facility; and</li> <li>Detainees not screened are housed separate from the general population.</li> </ul>	⊠			TB testing is completed during the admission process, unless a detainee is transferred from another facility with documentation of TB testing or similar medical clearance.
All detainees receive a mental-health screening upon arrival. It is conducted:  By a health care provider or specially trained officer; and Before a detainee's assignment to a housing unit.	⊠			Screening is completed by trained officers using a computerized questionnaire. Answers indicative of mental health concerns trigger a prompt referral to health care staff.
