

# How to Change Your Address with the Immigration Court and Government Attorneys

In this guide, we will review step-by-step how to prepare the forms you need to change your address with the Immigration Court and Government Attorneys (Office of Chief Counsel (OCC)).

A blank copy of these forms is included with this packet.

**DO NOT** mail your forms to us (NIJC) or to the ORR center where you were detained. You must mail your forms to both the Immigration Court and Government Attorneys (OCC) where you have your next court date.

You can read the **Know Your Rights** manual, and there are detailed instructions on **Change of Venue and Change of Address** procedures. - **Your A-Number:** This is your immigration identification number. It starts with “A” and has 9 numbers. It is included on all communication from Immigration. You can find it on your Notice to Appear (NTA).
- **Your new address and phone number:** Ask your sponsor for your new phone and address. For your safety, it is good to memorize this information.
- **Your old address:** You can find this address on your Notice to Appear (NTA) under your name.
- **Change of Address form (EOIR-33):** This document informs Immigration of your new address so that you can receive your immigration notices by mail.
- **A Change of Venue form:** This form asks the Court to change your hearings to the court closest to your new address.
- **The address of the Immigration Court of your next hearing**
- **The address of the Government Attorneys (OCC) at your next hearing location**

**Instructions:** To complete this form, fill out all blanks below, including the proof of service, which certifies that you have provided a copy of this form to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). After filling in the blanks and signing both the declaration and proof of service, you must submit the form in person or by mail. If submitting the form by mail, follow the mailing instructions on page two. You must submit a separate copy of this form for each individual in immigration court proceedings (i.e., you must submit a form for each person who has a case pending in immigration court and whom the change of address or phone number affects).

You must file this form with the immigration court within five working days of the change to your address or phone number, or your receipt of a charging document (e.g., a Notice to Appear) with incorrect contact information. The immigration court will send all official correspondence (e.g., date, time, and place of hearings) to the address you provide. The immigration court will only make any change(s) to your address and phone number in EOIR's records upon receipt of this form; the immigration court will not change your address or phone number based on a different address or phone number on pleadings, motions, or other communications with the court.

If you fail to appear at any hearing before an immigration judge when notice of that hearing or other official correspondence was served on you or sent to the address you provided, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) may take you into custody. In addition, the immigration court may conduct your hearing in your absence and enter an order of removal, deportation, or exclusion against you. If the court enters such an order, you may be ineligible for certain forms of relief from removal under the Immigration and Nationality Act as follows:

**Removal proceedings:** You will be subject to an order of removal for a period of ten years after the date of entry of the final order. You will also become ineligible for voluntary departure, cancellation of removal, and adjustment of status or change of status.

**Deportation proceedings:** You will be subject to an order of deportation for a period of five years after the date of the entry of the final order. You will also become ineligible for voluntary departure, suspension of deportation or voluntary departure, and adjustment of status.

**Admission proceedings:** Your application for admission to the United States may be considered withdrawn.

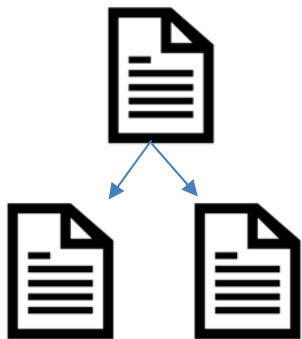

What do I do with them  
now?

1. Make two copies of each document



2. Mail the original COV and original COA to the Immigration Court where your case currently is scheduled.

3. Mail one copy of the COV and one copy of the COA to the Government Attorneys.

4. Keep one copy of the COV and one copy of the COA in safe place for your records.

We recommend that you send the documents via certified mail so you have proof that you sent them. With certified mail, you will receive a receipt when the documents are delivered.

You can send certified mail at a post office.



After you send the documents, continue calling the Immigration Court at 800-898-7180 **every week** to verify that your case was moved to a court closer to where you are currently living.

**On the following pages you will find addresses of all the non-detained Immigration Courts and Government Attorneys (Offices of Chief Counsel, or OCC) throughout the United States where you will need to send your documents, depending on where you live.**
